OTRA 2023 Michelin NCM Bash

Next April I will be leading a caravan to the National Corvette Museum for the annual Michelin NCM Bash. This event is held annually and is one of the premier events hosted at the museum. This event kicks off the NCM onsite event season and is usually the last weekend in April (27 - 29).

During this event there are usually seminars and classroom sessions. Seminars will usually feature presentation by the Bowling Green Assembly Plant, Michelin, and Mobil 1. There are also classroom sessions conducted by Corvette engineers. There are product demonstrations by the Corvette Store partners, live auctions, book signings, and the museum usually offers guided road tours around Bowling Green area. This is just a sampling of what this event entails. Also, GM usually shows off new models, paint colors, etc. that may be coming out soon.

I am planning on leaving Southern California Friday April 21st and returning Monday May 8th. I have put together a tentative plan which I will outline below. Remember this plan is subject to change but I hope to be able to stop and do some sightseeing at these locations.

Day 17Santa Rosa, NM to Williams, AZ

Day 18 Williams, AZ to So Cal (Home)

This took place on the Mulsanne Straight where speeds are around 200 mph. The hit knocked the Corvette nose first into the guardrail of the track and pretty much tore the car apart. At the time, the Corvette was battling one of the Ferrari's for the lead in class. This was the last year of the GTE Pro class.

About Nitt Witt Ridge

Nitt Witt Ridge, a California Registered Historical Landmark #939, is a house on a quarter acre in Cambria. Reclusive artist Arthur "Art" Harold Beal bought his hillside lot in 1928 and spent most of the next 50 years carving out the terraces with only a pick and shovel and creating his own "castle on a hill." Some parts of the dwelling are remnants from Hearst Castle, where he reportedly worked for a time. Other common building materials include beer cans, abalone shells, concrete, washer drums, car rims, tile, car parts, and old stoves. This blend of native materials and contemporary elements, impressive in its sheer mass and meticulous placement, is a revealing memorial to Art's unique cosmic humor and zest for life. The tour lasts approximately 40 minutes. PLEASE NOTE: Nitt Witt Ridge is NOT ADA compliant, offers no restroom, and is not built to code. Cost to attend this outing is \$10 per person. 



IMPORTANT INFORMATION From Pat Patterson!!

To all my fellow club members: On 6/2/2022, I received a notification from On Star that it had detected a problem with the engine or transmission on my C8. We were on our way to **F.I.T.S.**, so I didn't pay much attention to the check engine light... It ran okay. On 06/07 it went in to the local dealer. After Three Hours, the dealer called me to inform me it had been fixed.. It seems some of the wiring had been chewed by rat-rats. They fixed it but said if it happens again they would have to pull the engine to get to the wiring harness. He commented that this was fairly common on later model cars, not just GM cars. He left the droppings so I could see where they were, and then cleaned them out. The Porsche dealer told me the same thing. They have the same problem even on the display floor. It seems the insulation on the wires are vegetable based and cause them to be attractive to varmints. I have traps in the garage now. I did find droppings in one corner of the garage where it had made its home. It also seemed to like my bag of snail pellets.
