Planning a Day Trip Event

(Revised 9-14-2021)

- A. Select your favorite roads and/or destination and maybe pick a theme for your run.
- B. Coordinate a date with the Vice President.
- C. Review the caravan leader's day trip guideline.
 - a. It is advisable to do a "pre-run" with the following things in mind.
 - Select a convenient meeting place with ample parking, easy access in and out, and restrooms.
 - ii. A few of CSC favorite jumping off spots are the former CoCo's on Valley View in Garden Grove (no restrooms), the Block of Orange next to Krispy Kream, and the Laguna Hills mall off El Toro Road.
 - b. If you plan a breakfast or lunch stop during the run, look for restaurants that can accommodate a large group. (It is a good idea to talk to the manager to let them know what you have in mind and when maybe they can work out a special deal for the group.) Also be sure and check the restaurant's parking lot to insure there is easy access/egress and that it is large enough to park all the cars in your caravan.
 - c. Look for safe places to "regroup" in case the group gets split up by lights or traffic.
 - d. You might want to consider taking along someone to help you make notes on your pre-run so you can write up directions, odometer mileage readings, and road signs to follow.
 - e. Have we mentioned the importance of restrooms?
- D. Once you have completed your pre-run create a flyer for the newsletter. The flyer should contain the following information:
 - a. Start time and location
 - i. Where are we meeting?
 - ii. When are we meeting?
 - b. What are we doing?
 - i. Cruise only
 - ii. Cruise to a destination
 - iii. With or without lunch/dinner
 - c. General location of where you are going
 - d. Destination address (unless it is a mystery or poker type run)
 - e. Type of restaurant if appropriate, or whether to pack a lunch
 - f. Whether the run will be canceled in case of rain.
 - g. RSVP information (i.e., contact number or email address) if needed for the restaurant or other accommodations.
 - E. Provide a copy of the event flyer to the Vice President for approval. Once approved mail a copy to the newsletter editor to be included in the next newsletter.
 - F. At the General Membership meeting at least a month prior to your run, prepare and make sufficient copies of the flyer to hand out to those interested in the run.
 - G. A week or so prior to your run, contact the restaurant or others that may need to prepare for our arrival.
 - H. A few other suggestions:
 - a. Avoid dirt and gravel roads! Rocks and fiberglass do not mix!
 - b. Consider combining the run with an activity like a wine tour, museum visit, etc.
 - Those that have already sponsored a run are good resources for tips and, of course, just remember, the idea is to have fun.

CARAVAN LEADER GUIDELINES DAY TRIP

(Revised 9-14-2021)

Every CSC Caravan needs a leader. The leader is responsible for various items involved in having a successful and safe caravan. The guidelines mentioned on this page can apply to simple day trips, and longer multi-day road trips. A well planned and organized Corvette caravan is a pretty sight on the road!

Below are some of the areas of responsibility that need to be addressed and monitored by the leader:

A starting/departure point must be established prior to the event. This information should be on the event flyer along with the date, time, location, and final destination.

Begin with a "drivers meeting" 10-15minutes before departure. At this time, the route, stops and destination should be explained.

A method of communicating between caravan members needs to be established. CB radios have proven to be a particularly good and reliable method for communicating, however, the trend is moving toward the hand-held "FRS" type walkie-talkies. Select a beginning channel, with the possibility of changing to another channel if the primary one becomes too busy. For members who do not have a CB or walkie-talkie provide them with your cell phone number so they can communicate with the caravan leader.

One Corvette driver should be selected to be the caravan's designated last car or "back door. That person is responsible for assisting the leader by keeping him informed on how well the group is staying together or if someone is having car problems. The back door must have good communications with the leader, as that is how the caravan will stay together by adjusting speed and/or allowing for heavy traffic. The goal is to keep the caravan speed close to the general flow of traffic.

If possible, maps and/or detailed directions should be provided and handed out to each driver. No variations to the route should be made once on the road, as it can be confusing to caravan members further back in the group. Changes could be made, but ONLY if there is good communication between ALL cars in the caravan. Those who are unable to communicate (e.g., no CB, walk-talkie, or cellphone) create extra work and pressure for the leader, and the back door, who are trying to keep the caravan together.

Any planned fuel, rest, or food stops should be communicated before departure. Any unplanned stops will be worked out by the leader and back door, and hopefully can be arranged far enough ahead that all cars without communications will be able to stay with the group.

At the planned stop, the leader should determine if anyone in the caravan has medical or mechanical issues. Also, ask if anyone will be leaving the group during the caravan so there will not be any missing cars that aren't accounted for.

Once on the road, the leader must do everything possible to ensure that the caravan stays together. Try to maintain an even speed to allow all to keep the caravan in sight, even in heavy traffic. If you see or are notified by your back door that the caravan has become split up, if possible, pull over at the first safe place to do so, and wait for the rest to catch up. If stopping is not an option (on the freeway), move over to the slow lane, slow down to the speed limit and wait for the group to catch up. The back door will let you know when the group is together. Do not "run off" and leave the group behind — this is your caravan, so take ownership of it, and arrive at your destination as an organized and orderly group. The caravan members expect it of you, and not everyone has the same level of experience or comfort traveling as a group. It is your job to ensure that all have a good time and will want to do it again!

CARAVAN GUIDELINES DAY TRIP

(Revised 9-14-2021)

Participating in a CSC caravan can be a lot of fun, but only if it is orderly and well organized. At all times be courteous and aware of traffic around you. This guideline applies to local day trips. Here are some basic, proven guidelines for a safe and successful caravan:

Each caravan should have a Caravan Leader - the "Front Door" and a designated last car - the "Back Door."

The Caravan Leader is responsible for the caravan and any questions should be directed to that person. The Caravan Leader should also provide you with the plan for day trip. The plan should show the destination, mileage, rest stops, and any food stops. Before departure, the Caravan Leader should hold a driver's meeting to review the plan for the day and identify who will be the "Back Door".

PLEASE BE ON TIME! Have your gas tank full and any maintenance completed before departure. Also, at the initial drivers meeting, be sure to inform the leader of your car's cruising speed or mileage limitations, so fuel stops can be planned accordingly.

Anyone with medical experience should make this known to the group. The same thing applies for those with considerable mechanical skills.

Ideally, all cars in the caravan should have a CB Radio or Walkie Talkie. At a minimum, the front and back door cars should have a CB or Walkie Talkie. The Caravan Leader will identify an initial channel and alternate if the primary channel becomes too "busy", the Caravan Leader will notify every one of the change. The Caravan leader should also provide everyone with his/her cell phone in case of an emergency.

The back door has numerous functions – watching for "laggers", mechanical failures, losing people at traffic lights, and faster traffic approaching from the rear. The back door should also coordinate lane changes with the leader.

Once on the road try to maintain a constant distance between you and the Corvette ahead of you. Use a larger gap at night or in wet weather. Do not leave too much of a gap, as it tends to frustrate drivers behind you, allows too many non-caravan drivers to get into our group, and causes the group to gradually split up or start the "bungee cord" effect of speeding up and rapid braking which disrupts the rhythm and safety of the caravan. If you are not comfortable with this guideline, let the Leader know and then drop back behind the Back Door car and go at your own pace.

If a member of the caravan has mechanical problems, only the following car should pull out of the caravan to assist. The rest of the caravan will continue to the next scheduled stop.

Do not pass another caravan member unless that car is obviously leaving too large a gap and making no effort to close to the proper interval. Do not pass the Caravan Leader unless previously discussed. It is important that the caravan moves at the same general speed as other traffic, since going too slow will cause problems for both the caravan and other drivers. Always use your turn signals when changing lanes or merging left or right.

If you must leave the caravan at any time, do not try to resume your previous place in line. Just come back to the last position just in front of the back door who ill create space for you to rejoin the group.

Always allow other traffic to merge with us when necessary. Be particularly aware that large trucks are limited in maneuverability and require more room for stopping quickly. Also, on hilly roads, they cannot afford to lose their speed and engine "revs".

When passing a non-caravan vehicle on a two-lane road, continue accelerating for a while to allow some extra room for any cars that may have followed you during the pass to get back into the correct lane.

These are all "common sense" guidelines developed through experience over many years and many Corvette caravans. Safety always comes first but having a lot of fun is a close second!

The Supercharged C8 is driving! The report from the development team is super enthusiastic. The power feels very good (final validation measurement pending). The sounds coming from the new supercharger design are fantastic. And just what we hoped for. The responsiveness of the charge air delivery to the engine is very precise and follows the throttle input, perfectly, smoothly, and at the very quick demand of the throttle. A really exciting driving experience, especially the SC noise. On downshift, from inside and outside the car, the DD exhaust has come into its own. Nothing else sounds and acts like the Double D. The sounds here are such deep indicators of what we want from the C8. The driving experience from the C8 in general is so good, so pleasing, so mature and so nearly perfect that we have to bring two other elements to our version of the car. The exhaust signature and the sound of power from the engine compartment. Both of those elements are there in the most pleasing and exciting sound statements. With the engine so close to the driver there is a lot to be heard from the engine on its mechanical side, and the compressor side of the charge delivery both at WOT (Wide Open Throttle) and on the downshifting steps of the wonderful rpm matching of the gearbox. We love it!
